Course Objectives:

You will learn how to make business decisions using accounting information. The main learning objectives of the course are: (1) the use of accounting information in managerial decision-making, (2) how accounting cost data must be tailored to specific management issues (3) the use of budgets and standard costs for planning and control and (4) the relation between costs, profits and level of activity.

Exams:

There will be two midterm exams scheduled during regular class time on 2/20 and 3/29 and a final exam during the final exam period (5/3 -5/9). Exams consist of short multiple-choice questions, including questions on concepts and computational problems. The exams focus on the material discussed in the class sessions and homework problems. However, the exam questions will ask you to apply the concepts in different ways. The final grade will be based on your total score. Grades will be curved up only for the letter grade if necessary. All exams are closed book and closed notes, but you are allowed a cheat sheet (one letter-sized sheet, 8.5*11", two-sided, HANDWRITTEN only). Bring a regular calculator for exams – you will not be allowed to use the calculator in your cell phone, tablet or other devices.

Ouizzes:

There will be 4 quizzes during the semester. Each quiz consists of 4 multiple-choice questions, including questions on concepts and short computational problems. You will have 15 minutes for each quiz. All quizzes are closed book and closed notes – NO cheat sheets will be allowed for quizzes. Bring a regular calculator – you will not be allowed to use the calculator in your cell phone, tablet or other devices.

Homework:

I use an online homework system from webassign.net. To sign up, go to webassign.net, and click on "I have a Class Key" (on the right-hand side). After that, enter the class key "rutgers.camden 1897 1912", and set up your account when prompted. The cost is \$22.95 per semester.

The homework is due at 9am on the date indicated on the course schedule. Please submit homework on time – the online system does not allow late submissions. <u>I will not grant extensions for late homework</u>, except in documented emergencies. If you have an emergency, please let me know <u>before</u> the homework deadline – <u>no excuses will be accepted after the homework is due</u>. If you do not advise me before the due date and need an extension to complete the homework for any reasons, <u>3 points out of 10</u> will be deducted as a penalty

If you use an old browser or some of the standard browser plug-ins are missing, you may run into technical problems in submitting your answers. The system requirements for webassign are available at http://www.webassign.net/manual/student_guide/c_a_system_requirements.htm. If you miss a homework deadline because your computer does not comply with these requirements, I will not grant an extension. In the unlikely case that webassign.net is down or does not function properly (and your computer complies with all the system requirements), let me know before the homework deadline – no excuses will be accepted after the homework is due.

The system gives you immediate feedback on right and wrong answers (indicated by V or X). You have 5 attempts to answer each question. There is no partial credit for wrong answers. For each question, you can open a practice version (with different numbers), with an unlimited number of attempts. You do not get credit for practice questions, but they allow you to figure things out without using up your 5 attempts. Feel free to email me with any questions about the homework (or any other issues). All emails will be answered within a day (however, if you email me less than a few hours before the homework is due, I might

Class Participation:

You are strongly encouraged to attend every lecture class. Your class participation points will be based mostly on attendance. Attendance will be taken every class. Up to three unexcused absences are allowed. However, after three unexcused absences, you will be considered having "excessive absences" and you will lose some of class participation points.

Almost every class has a pop quiz. The purpose of the quiz is for you to have time to study the materials in class and get help from me or other students if necessary. The quiz will have 1-3 questions on the current lecture. It is open-book/notes. You may use Google or any other sources. You can work individually or in groups of less than 5 persons. As long as you hand in the pop quiz, you will get 90% of the points assigned. You will get the remaining 10% if the answers are correct. The pop quiz grades will be added to the class participation points only if you have excessive absences.
