Course Content and Objectives

This course is designed to impart a detailed understanding of alternative accounting principles and practices, their effects on balance sheet valuation and income statements, including critical evaluation of these alternatives. Subjects covered include business combinations, parent and subsidiary companies, intercorporate transactions, foreign currency transactions, segment and interim reporting, partnership accounting and accounting for not-for-profit organization.
